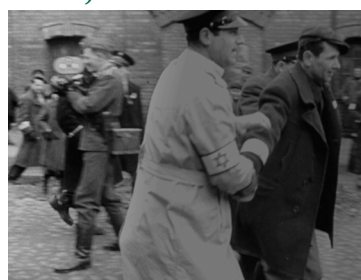
## Yom Ha'shoah (Holocaust Memorial Day) Commemoration

Keynote speaker, **Yitta Halberstam**, co-author of the very popular book series, "Small Miracles," will share true, extraordinary and inspiring stories from the rubble of the Holocaust. Yitta, the daughter of a Chassidic rabbi, pursued graduate studies in American Literature at New York University and taught Literature of the Holocaust at Baruch College. "Small Miracles" has been the subject of hundreds of radio and television shows, including Oprah, Good Day New York, and PBS' Evening Edition. ## Film, "A Film Unfinished" (88 min.)



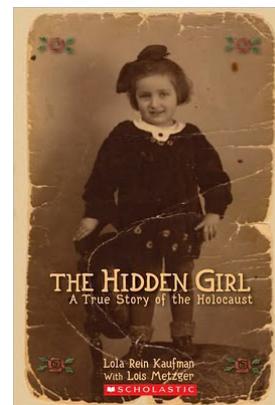
At the end of WWII, 60 minutes of raw film shot by the Nazis in Warsaw in May 1942 was discovered, and became a resource for historians seeking an authentic record of the Warsaw Ghetto. However, the later discovery of a

long missing reel, inclusive of multiple takes and cameraman staging scenes, complicated earlier readings of the footage. "A Film Unfinished" presents the raw footage in its entirety, carefully noting fictionalized sequences (including a staged dinner party) falsely showing "the good life" enjoyed by Jewish urbanites, and probes deep into the making of a now-infamous Nazi propaganda film.

## A Hidden Child Shares Her Story:

a talk and slide presentation by survivor **Lola Rein Kaufman** of New City, author of "The Hidden Girl: A True Story of the Holocaust." Lola Rein Kaufman, born in 1934, was just a young child when she lost her parents to the Nazi persecution. She spent the war years on her own, hiding and running. At the end of the war, her only possession was the little dress that her mother had lovingly made for her before they were separated forever. She has donated her dress to the US National Holocaust Museum in Washington, DC. The dress was also part of a traveling exhibit. Mrs. Kaufman traveled around the country with the exhibit, speaking to audiences about her experience.
